

U.S. Passport Services @Your Library!

The Round Lake Area Public Library will be an official Passport Acceptance Facility for the U. S. Department of State. The Library is very pleased to have this designation and to offer this convenience to anyone needing to submit a U.S. Passport Application (DS-11).

Individuals and families will be able to conveniently submit passport applications during the day; as well as on weekends and evening hours, when most passport offices are closed. We accept applications every

day up to one hour before the library closes. No appointment is necessary. Applications will be accepted on a first come, first served basis, and when necessary, a wait list will be implemented. Applicants are processed or added to the wait list only when necessary documents are complete and in order and all parties involved are present. The library does not take passport photos. Passport application forms are available at the Library. Before coming, please visit the U.S. Department of State's official page, www.travel.state.gov for precise details on what documents and fees are required. La Biblioteca será un centro de aceptación de pasaporte oficial para el Departamento del estado de Estados Unidos. La biblioteca está muy contenta con esta designación y poder ofrecer esta comodidad a cualquier persona que necesite presentar una solicitud de pasaporte de los Estados Unidos (DS-11). Individuos y familias podrán presentar convenientemente las solicitudes de pasaporte durante el día; así como en los fines de semana y horas de la tarde, cuando la mayoría de las oficinas de pasaporte están cerradas. Aceptamos aplicaciones todos los días hasta una hora antes de que cierre de la biblioteca. No es necesario hacer cita. Se aceptarán solicitudes y se sirve por orden de llegada, y cuando sea necesario, se implementará una lista de espera. Los solicitantes son procesados o añadidos a la lista de espera sólo cuando los documentos necesarios están completos y en orden y todas las partes involucradas están presentes. La biblioteca no toma fotos de pasaporte. Formularios de solicitud de pasaporte están disponibles en la biblioteca.
